

Emergency certificate of registration – approved supervisors

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Purpose

The purpose of this Policy is to define the minimum eligibility criteria for registrants seeking to be approved by the Registrar to supervise an emergency class registrant and to articulate the responsibilities of an approved supervisor.

Application

This Policy applies only to approved supervisors and only when the class is open.

Policy

Emergency class registrants may only practice under the supervision of a registrant approved by the Registrar.

Minimum eligibility criteria

To be approved as a supervisor, a registrant must, at minimum:

- currently hold an active speciality certificate of registration in the same specialty in which the emergency class registrant is educated and will be employed
- have held an active specialty certificate of registration for at least two (2) years
- sign a supervision agreement undertaking to supervise the practice of the emergency class registrant in accordance with this Policy
- be employed at the same employment location where the emergency class registrant will be employed

- not have any terms, conditions or limitations on their specialty certificate of registration that would prevent them from supervising another registrant
- not have been convicted of a criminal offence or offence related to the regulation of the practice of the profession of medical radiation and imaging technology
- not be the subject of a finding of professional misconduct, incompetence, or incapacity in Ontario in relation to another health profession or in another jurisdiction in relation to the profession of medical radiation and imaging technology or another health profession
- not supervise anyone with whom they have a conflict of interest

Even if a registrant meets these criteria, the Registrar maintains the absolute discretion to refuse to approve them as a supervisor.

Responsibilities

Approved supervisors of emergency class registrants must:

- be on site at all times that the emergency class registrant is performing procedures on patients
- ensure that the emergency class registrant is practising in accordance with the CMRITO Standards of Practice
- ensure that the emergency class registrant is competently performing procedures on patients in the specialty in which they were educated
- report any concerns about the emergency class registrant to the CMRITO in writing as soon as reasonably practicable after those concerns arise
