NOTICE OF ELECTION 2022

On April 1, 2022 CMRITO will hold elections in District 4 – magnetic resonance, District 5 – diagnostic medical sonography, District 6 – member at large. Submissions will be accepted for District 7 – academic member, which is an appointed position.

A call for nominations will be sent to members in Districts 4, 5, 6 and 7 in December 2021. The election of professional members to the CMRITO Council is an important component of self-regulation. Council members set policies to ensure the safe, effective and ethical practice of medical radiation and imaging technology services in the province and regulate the profession in the public interest.



2020 ANNUAL REPORT

Each year, the College is required by legislation to publish a comprehensive annual report for the Minister of Health that documents the College's activities, achievements and audited financial statements. We also proudly share the annual report with our members, stakeholders and the public.

The 2020 Annual Report was released in early June 2021 and marks the first Annual Report of the CMRITO, as the College became the CMRITO with the proclamation of the *Medical Radiation and Imaging Technology Act, 2017* on January 1, 2020.

While 2020 was certainly a different year for all of us, the Annual Report remains a record of the work and important initiatives that Council, committees and staff successfully developed and implemented in 2020.

CMRITO's mandatory Quality Assurance (QA) Program is designed to ensure that members maintain their competence in an ever-changing health care environment. There are two main components of the QA Program – the peer and practice assessment (Multi-source Feedback assessment) and the QA ePortfolio which every member must complete every year. The QA ePortfolio is very flexible and permits members to direct their own continuing education and professional development activities in topics that interest and benefit members in their current practice area(s) and helps to ensure their continued competence throughout their careers.

MULTI-SOURCE FEEDBACK ASSESSMENT 2021

Each year, a percentage of members are randomly selected to complete a peer and practice QA assessment by a Multi-source Feedback (MSF) assessment. This year, Council has cancelled the MSF assessment due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

QA EPORTFOLIO ASSESSMENTS

This year, 2,231 members were randomly selected to submit their 2021 QA ePortfolios for assessment. These members were notified of the requirement to submit their 2021 ePortfolio by email on April 21, 2021, and the deadline to submit the completed 2021 ePortfolios is January 7, 2022.

You will see a reminder alert on your MAP account if you are required to submit your 2021 QA ePortfolio for assessment. Please sign into MAP to check for this alert and for a copy of the email notice sent on April 21, 2021. This email, along with instructions on how to submit your ePortfolio, will be in the QA Notices section of your account.



TIPS FOR COMPLETING YOUR QA EPORTFOLIO

Now that we're in the last couple of months of 2021, all members should have the ePortfolio QA Profile and Self-assessments complete, and most of the 25 hours of continuing education and professional development activities completed and recorded as well.



Members can choose which continuing education and professional development activities they will complete in any given year – the learning activities do not need to be certified or approved by the CMRITO or professional associations for you to include them in your QA ePortfolio. Instead, what is most important is that you can explain what you learned and how that learning helps you in your practice.

Your 25 hours of continuing education and professional development activities may include the following:

- professional readings
- · webinars, seminars, courses
- learning from other health professionals (e.g., attendance at rounds, tutorials, and staff meetings)
- · training on new equipment or applications
- researching/writing a professional journal article or presentation
- reviewing and applying practice and protocol changes (such as new or changed practices due to COVID-19)

DID YOU KNOW?

Clinical teaching and training of others (e.g., students, new co-workers) can also be included as a professional development activity in your ePortfolio. To include teaching and training activities in your ePortfolio as part of your continuing education and professional development, log the amount of time you spent:

- preparing a lesson/presentation
- · participating in case reviews with the student/staff
- reviewing policies/practices/protocols
- researching interesting cases with the student/staff

Remember to count and record only the time you spent learning from teaching and training experiences, and not the time you were teaching and the student was learning. And, as with all learning activities, you must explain what you learned from the experience and how it helped you in your practice.

THAT'S A GOOD QUESTION!

The practice of a regulated health professional can be very complex. We're happy when MRITs ask us to help them understand topics like practice standards, patient communication and consent, or the role and responsibilities of CMRITO in regulating the profession of medical radiation and imaging technology. In 'That's a good question!' we answer some of the most frequent questions MRITs ask us.

As a manager, can I hire a new graduate before they are registered with CMRITO?

Students who have completed one of the approved educational programs in one of the specialties of radiography, radiation therapy, nuclear medicine, magnetic resonance and diagnostic medical sonography in Ontario are able to be hired while waiting for examination results. However, there are a number of restrictions on the activities that a new graduate can perform prior to their registration with CMRITO.

ing. In order to practice the profession of medical radiation and imaging technology in Ontario, an individual **must** be registered with CMRITO.

There are exemptions in legislation that permit students in approved educational programs to perform authorized acts and to apply ionizing radiation, electromagnetism for MRI, and soundwaves for diagnostic medical sonography while they are actively enrolled in the approved educational program, provided they are supervised by a member of CMRITO. However, these exemptions don't apply after a person is no longer a student.

An individual who has completed an approved educational program, but is not yet registered with the College is:

- not able to hold themselves out as a medical radiation and imaging technologist or a person qualified to practice in a specialty of medical radiation and imaging technology - MRT(R), MRT(T), MRT(N), MRT(MR) or DMS
- not authorized to apply ionizing radiation, electromagnetism for MRI, or soundwaves for diagnostic medical sonography
- not authorized to perform any of the controlled acts authorized to CMRITO members, including:
 - · administering substances by injection or inhalation
 - administering contrast media or putting an instrument, hand or finger beyond the opening of the urethra, labia majora, anal verge or into an artificial opening of the body
 - · performing a procedure on tissue below the dermis

The same restrictions apply even if the new graduate is supervised by a member of CMRITO.

SUMMARY OF DISCIPLINE HEARING JANICE G. MIZEN

The Discipline Committee is responsible for holding hearings related to professional misconduct and incompetence allegations referred by the Inquiries, Complaints and Reports Committee.

In September 2021, a discipline hearing was held via videoconference by Zoom. A summary of that hearing is set out below and now appears on the member's public register profile.

On September 2, 2021, a panel of the Discipline Committee (the Panel) held a hearing to consider allegations of professional misconduct regarding member Janice G. Mizen. The hearing proceeded by way of an agreed statement of facts wherein Janice G. Mizen admitted that she inappropriately accessed the personal health information and/or electronic medical records of 27 patients without consent or proper authorization.

The Panel found Janice G. Mizen to have committed acts of professional misconduct in that she:

- failed to maintain the standards of practice of the profession;
- contravened a federal, provincial, or territorial law, a municipal by-law, or a by-law or rule of a hospital
 within the meaning of the Public Hospitals Act, by accessing the personal health information and/or
 electronic medical records for 27 patients without consent or proper authorization while employed at St.
 Mary's General Hospital in Kitchener, Ontario, contrary to the *Personal Health Information Protection*Act, 2004, and/or the rules of the hospital; and
- engaged in conduct or performed an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard
 to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by members as disgraceful, dishonourable or
 unprofessional.

The Panel accepted a joint submission on penalty and made the following order:

- that Janice G. Mizen be required to appear before the Panel of the Discipline Committee via video to be reprimanded on September 2, 2021;
- that the Registrar impose specified terms, conditions and limitations on Janice G. Mizen's certificate of registration, requiring that she must successfully complete:
 - · all of the modules of CMRITO's online Jurisprudence Course and the associated online quiz, and
 - the online Privacy Awareness in Health Care Training Ontario course offered by Corridor Interactive, at her expense, by no later than November 1, 2021; and
- that Janice G. Mizen pay CMRITO's costs in the amount of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00), payable by no later than September 2, 2022.

During the oral reprimand, the Panel indicated that of special concern was the fact that the professional misconduct in which Janice G. Mizen engaged involved accessing the personal health information and/or electronic medical records for numerous patients without consent or proper authorization over an extended period of time.

SUSPENDED MEMBERS

The following members' certificates of registration were suspended between April 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021 for failure to pay their fees in accordance with section 24 of the Health Professions Procedural Code. A person whose certificate of registration has been suspended is not a member of the CMRITO and cannot legally practice as a medical radiation and imaging technologist unless and until the suspension is removed.
