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Members of Council 2019-2020

CMRTO's getting a new look!

As most of our stakeholders and members know, CMRTO is looking forward to using our new name – College of Medical Radiation and Imaging Technologists of Ontario – to reflect the addition of diagnostic medical sonography as our fifth specialty. But we can't do that until the *Medical Radiation and Imaging Technology Act, 2017* (MRIT Act), is proclaimed in force by the government. The MRIT Act will repeal and replace the *Medical Radiation Technology*

Act, 1991, and change the name of the CMRTO to the College of Medical Radiation and Imaging Technologists of Ontario, the name of the profession to medical radiation and imaging technology, and the restricted title to medical radiation and imaging technologist.

In anticipation of the MRIT Act coming into force, CMRTO has developed a new website using the new visual identity approved by Council in June 2018. This site will be easier for the public and members to navigate, employs the latest web development techniques and tools, and addresses a number of critical technical issues. However, CMRTO is unable to release this new site as developed until the MRIT Act is proclaimed in force and it is unknown when this will occur.

Council held a special meeting on July 16, 2019 and considered a proposal to alter the College's identity to leverage the previously approved new logo and state the role of the College to improve transparency to the public and to members. Council also received and considered legal advice on the proposal from the College's external legal advisors.

After careful consideration, Council approved a new visual identity for CMRTO that includes the new logo approved by Council in June 2018, the acronym for the current legal name of the College, and a descriptor of the role of the College.

Council also directed that the new visual identity be applied to the new website currently under development, that the content of the site be revised to reflect the current legislation (MRT Act), and that the new website and visual identity be released when ready in September 2019.

Below is the updated CMRTO visual identity, as approved by Council.




2018 Annual Report

Each year, the CMRTO publishes a comprehensive annual report that documents our activities, achievements and audited financial statements for the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care, and we proudly share it with our members, stakeholders and the public. Council, committees and staff members worked tirelessly throughout 2018 to successfully develop and implement many important initiatives that are highlighted in this report, including:

 registering diagnostic medical sonographers. Building upon the work started in 2017, CMRTO introduced an online application process for diagnostic medical sonographers on January 1, 2018



- supporting the new application process, CMRTO worked with our external partners to upgrade our customer relationship management software and customize new features on our website to meet our registration needs
- training current and new Registration staff to ensure that diagnostic medical sonographers who applied for registration with CMRTO by the administrative deadline of November 16, 2018 would have their application reviewed in time for December 31, 2018 registration
- reviewing, approving and registering 3,625 diagnostic medical sonographers with CMRTO in 2018, with an additional 257 approved for registration
- developing and releasing three updated foundational documents for members – the CMRTO Standards of Practice, the Code of Ethics, and the QA Program
- developing a new logo and website in anticipation of the Medical Radiation and Imaging Technology Act,
 2017 coming into force (By year end 2018, the Act had yet to come into force.)
- bolstering our communication efforts in order to reach and engage with members through information sessions, webinars, conferences, presentations, email communications and social media
- streamlining our previous eight by-laws into a single, comprehensive by-law to prepare for the regulation of diagnostic medical sonographers. In addition to consolidating elements of the previous by-laws into a

single by-law, By-law No. 60 also introduced significant changes to the composition of CMRTO Council and its electoral districts. Following its approval by Council in September, the clauses pertaining to elections came into force on October 1, 2018 while all other elements came into force on January 1, 2019

We hope you make time to read CMRTO's 2018 Annual Report and enjoy learning about all of our activities and initiatives over the past year.

Quality Assurance update

Every CMRTO member is required to complete the QA ePortfolio and to complete and record at least 25 hours of continuing education and professional development activities each year. To ensure timely completion of the QA ePortfolio, we recommend that members review their ePortfolio and record any continuing education and professional development activities to ensure they are on target for the year-end deadline. Remember, we have now passed the midway point of the QA year!

As of January 2, 2019, more than 3,867 active diagnostic medical sonographers were registered with CMRTO and we currently have over 11,000 registered medical radiation and imaging technologists. However, as of June 30, 2019, 50% of members had not yet started their 2019 QA ePortfolio, while only 5% had completed it.

2019 Quality Assurance assessments

Have you been notified that you are required to submit your 2019 QA ePortfolio for assessment?

Each year, a percentage of CMRTO members are randomly selected for the Multi-Source Feedback (MSF) and QA ePortfolio assessment processes.

In April 2019, 1,502 members were notified by mail and email that they are required to submit their 2019 QA ePortfolio for assessment no later than January 3, 2020. If you have been selected, you may submit your ePortfolio at any time before the deadline by clicking the 'Submit to CMRTO' button in the 'Summary' tab of your ePortfolio.

In addition, 425 members were randomly selected to complete the Multi-Source Feedback assessment program in 2019. Their MSF kits were mailed out at the end of March. The deadline for all surveys to be submitted was May 24, 2019. The results are now being collated by a third-party company, Cido, on behalf of the QA

Committee. Members being assessed will receive their MSF assessment results at the end of August.

Please note that all members, including those selected for an MSF assessment, are still required to complete their QA ePortfolio for 2019!

MAP – the CMRTO Member & Applicant Portal

In March of 2018, CMRTO introduced a new Member & Applicant Portal (MAP) on our website. MAP allows members to reinstate, resign, request out of province certificates and letters of good standing, and request a change of name online.

The application process, including uploading documents, can now be completed entirely online as well. Applicants can see the status of their applications and receive email notifications when they have reached important milestones in the process. Once applicants have completed all the registration requirements and are ready to register with the CMRTO, they can do that online too!

Additionally, all fee payments are completely electronic through Visa, Mastercard and Interac. Access to past receipts is also available to both active and resigned members via MAP.

Please note that you must use Google Chrome when accessing MAP as not all features function properly in other browsers.

As well, if you are expecting an email from CMRTO and do not receive it, please check your spam and junk folders. Then be sure to add registration@cmrto.org and communications@cmrto.org to your email address book, contacts, and safe senders lists to ensure that you receive future communications from CMRTO.

Finally, it is important to note that members are required to update their MAP information within seven days of any change in home address or place of business. This information feeds into the Public Register and is updated in real time. The Public Register is your sole proof of registration status for your employer and the public – CMRTO no longer issues wallet cards.

Suspended members

The following members' certificates of registration were suspended between April 1, 2019 and June 30, 2019 for failure to pay their fees in accordance with section 24 of the Health Professions Procedural Code.

A person whose certificate of registration has been suspended is not a member of the CMRTO unless and until the suspension is removed.
