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Legislative Requirement

In accordance with the Health Professions Procedural Code (the Code) being Schedule 2 to the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991* (the RHPA), the College is required to ensure that the individuals assessing qualifications, making registration decisions, or reviewing registration decisions have received training that includes, where appropriate:

- training on how to assess such qualifications and make such decisions
- training in any special considerations that may apply in the assessment of applications and the process for applying those considerations

Policy

Training will be provided for all members of the Registration Committee on a regular basis by the College's legal counsel and staff.

Training for new members of the Registration Committee will include an orientation to:

- the RHPA and the Code, which define the roles and responsibilities of the Registration Committee

- the *Medical Radiation and Imaging Technology Act, 2017* (the MRIT Act) and the Registration Regulation¹
- requirements under related legislation such as the *Fair Access to Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act, 2006* and Ontario's *Human Rights Code*
- the assessment methods and criteria used by the Registration Committee in determining whether an applicant meets the requirements for registration

Where appropriate, training workshops in credential and program assessment methods from third party organizations may be utilized as an option for additional training.
