Legislative Requirement

In accordance with the Health Professions Procedural Code (the Code), being Schedule 2 to the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991*, after considering an application for registration and the applicant's submissions (if submissions are received), a panel of the Registration Committee (the Committee) may make an order doing any one or more of the following:

- directing the Registrar to issue a certificate of registration
- directing the Registrar to issue a certificate of registration if the applicant successfully completes examinations set or approved by the panel
- directing the Registrar to issue a certificate of registration if the applicant successfully completes additional training specified by the panel
- directing the Registrar to impose specified terms, conditions and limitations (TCLs) on a certificate of registration of the applicant and specifying a limitation on the applicant's right to apply for a variation of those TCLs
- directing the Registrar to refuse to issue a certificate of registration

Policy

Before making an order, a panel of the Committee will consider the application and any written submissions made by the applicant within the time period set out in the Registrar's referral notice.
